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# Safety precautions

# Power safety



Please follow these safety instructions for best performance, and long life for your monitor.













- The AC plug isolates this equipment from the AC supply.
- The power supply cord serves as a power disconnect device for pluggable equipment. The socket outlet should be installed near the equipment and be easily accessible.
- This product should be operated from the type of power indicated on the marked label. If you are not sure of the type of power available, consult your dealer or local power company.
- The Class I pluggable equipment Type A must be connected to protective earth.
- An approved power cord greater or equal to H03VV-F or H05VV-F, 2G or 3G, 0.75mm<sup>2</sup> must be used.
- Use only the power cord provided by BenQ. Never use a power cord that appears to be damaged or frayed.
- To avoid possible damage to the monitor, do not use it in a region where power supply is unstable.
- Ensure that the power cord is connected to a grounded power outlet before turning on the monitor.
- To avoid possible danger, observe the total electric load when using the monitor with a (multi-outlet) extension cord.
- Always turn off the monitor before unplugging the power cord.

#### For Germany only:

- (If the weight of the product is less than or equal to 3 kg) An approved power cord greater or equal to H03VV-F, 3G, 0.75mm<sup>2</sup> must be used.
- (If the weight of the product is more than 3 kg) An approved power cord greater or equal to H05VV-F or H05RR-F. 3G. 0.75mm<sup>2</sup> must be used.
- (If a remote control is provided) RISK OF EXPLOSION IF BATTERY IS REPLACED BY AN INCORRECT TYPE. DISPOSE OF USED BATTERIES ACCORDING TO THE INSTRUCTIONS.

#### For models with adapter:

- Use only the power adapter supplied with your product. Use of another type of power adapter will result in malfunction and/or danger.
- Allow adequate ventilation around the adapter when using it to operate the device or charge the battery. Do not cover the power adapter with paper or other objects that will reduce cooling. Do not use the power adapter while it is inside a carrying case.
- Connect the power adapter to a proper power source.
- Do not attempt to service the power adapter. There are no service parts inside. Replace the unit if it is damaged or exposed to excess moisture.

#### Installation

- Do not use your monitor under any of the following environmental conditions:
  - Extremely high or low temperature, or in direct sunlight

- Dusty places
- · Highly humid, exposed to rain, or close to water
- Exposed to vibrations or impacts in places such as cars, buses, trains, and other rail vehicles
- Near heating appliances such as radiators, heaters, fuel stoves, and other heat-generating items (including audio amplifiers)
- An enclosed place (such as a closet or bookcase) without appropriate ventilation
- · An uneven or sloping surface
- Exposed to chemical substances or smoke
- Carry the monitor carefully.
- Do not place heavy loads on the monitor to avoid possible personal injury or damage to the monitor.
- Ensure that children do not hang or climb onto the monitor.
- · Keep all packing bags out of reach of children.

# Operation

- To protect your eyesight, please refer to the user manual to set the optimal screen resolution and the viewing distance.
- To reduce eye fatigue, take a break on a regular basis while using the monitor.
- Avoid taking either one of the following actions for a long time. Otherwise, burn marks may occur.
  - Play images that cannot occupy the screen entirely.
  - Place a still image on the screen.
- To avoid possible damage to the monitor, do not touch the monitor panel by finger tip, pen, or any other sharp objects.
- Excessively frequent plug and unplug of video connectors may cause damage to the monitor.
- This monitor is designed mainly for personal use. If you want to use the monitor in a public place or a harsh environment, contact your nearest BenQ service center for assistance.
- To avoid possible electric shock, do not dissemble or repair the monitor.
- If a bad smell or an abnormal sound appears to come from the monitor, contact your nearest BenQ service center for assistance immediately.

#### Caution

- The distance between you and the monitor should be 2.5 to 3 times the diagonal width of the screen.
- Looking at the screen for an extended period of time causes eye fatigue and may deteriorate your eyesight. Rest your eyes for 5 ~ 10 minutes for every 1 hour of product use.
- Reduce your eye strain by focusing on objects far way.
- Frequent blinking and eye exercise help keep your eyes from drying out.

# Safety notice for remote control (applicable if a remote control is provided)

- Do not put the remote control in the direct heat, humidity, and avoid fire.
- Do not drop the remote control.
- Do not expose the remote control to water or moisture. Failure to do so could result in malfunction.
- Confirm there is no object between the remote control and the remote sensor of the product.
- When the remote control will not be used for an extended period, remove the batteries.

# Battery safety notice (applicable if a remote control is provided)

The use of the wrong type of batteries may cause chemical leaks or explosion. Please note the following:

- Always ensure that the batteries are inserted with the positive and negative terminals in the correct direction as shown in the battery compartment.
- Different types of batteries have different characteristics. Do not mix different types.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries will shorten battery life or cause chemical leaks from the old batteries.
- When batteries fail to function, replace them immediately.

If the supplied remote control contains a coin / button cell battery, pay attention to the following notice as well.

- · Do not ingest battery. Chemical Burn Hazard.
- The remote control supplied with this product contains a coin / button cell battery. If the coin / button cell battery is swallowed, it can cause severe internal burns in just 2 hours and can lead to death.
- Keep new and used batteries away from children. If the battery compartment does not close securely, stop using the product and keep it away from children.
- If you think batteries might have been swallowed or placed inside any part of the body, seek immediate medical attention.

# Care and cleaning

- Do not place the monitor face down on the floor or a desk surface directly. Otherwise, scratches on the panel surface may occur.
- The equipment is to be secured to the building structure before operation.
- (For models that support wall or ceiling mounting)
  - Install your monitor and monitor mounting kit on a wall with flat surface.
  - Ensure that the wall material and the standard wall mount bracket (purchased separately) are stable enough to support the weight of the monitor.
  - Turn off the monitor and the power before disconnecting the cables from the monitor.
- Always unplug the product from the power outlet before cleaning. Clean the monitor surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Avoid using any liquid, aerosol or glass cleaners.
- Slots and openings on the back or top of the cabinet are for ventilation. They must not be blocked or covered. Your monitor should never be placed near or over a radiator or heat sources, or in a built-in installation unless proper ventilation is provided.
- Do not place heavy loads on the monitor to avoid possible personal injury or damage to the monitor.
- Consider keeping the box and packaging in storage for use in the future when you may need to transport the monitor.
- Refer to the product label for information on power rating, manufacture date, and identification markings.

# Servicing

- Do not attempt to service this product yourself, as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltages or other risks. If any of the above mentioned misuse or other accident such as dropping or mishandling occurs, contact qualified service personnel for servicing.





# Power delivery of USB-C™ ports on your monitor

With the power delivery function, your monitor helps supply power to the connected USB- $C^{\text{m}}$  devices. Available power varies by port. Make sure the devices are connected to the appropriate ports to be activated properly with sufficient power.

- The connected device can be charged via USB-C<sup>™</sup> port even when the monitor is in power saving mode.(\*)
- The USB power delivery is up to 90W. If the connected device requires more than the delivered power for operation or for boot up (when the battery is drained), use the original power adapter that came with the device.

If a separately purchased USB-C™ cable is used, make sure the cable is certified by USB-IF and is full-featured, with power delivery and video / audio / data transfer functions.



# Installing the battery


 Turn over the remote control. Use a cross-pointed screwdriver to release the screw that fixing the cover to the remote control, and then detach the cover as illustrated. The use of a magnetic-head screwdriver is recommended to avoid of losing the screw




2. Press down the upper part of the battery so you can remove the battery from the lower part as illustrated.




3. Remove the battery insulation sheet.



4. Replace the provided battery (CR2032) onto the battery holder properly. Make sure that the positive terminal (+) faces upward.



5. Replace the battery cover and secure the screw. The remote control is ready to use now.


# How to assemble your monitor hardware



- If the computer is turned on you must turn it off before continuing.
   Do not plug-in or turn-on the power to the monitor until instructed to do so.
- The following illustrations are for your reference only. Available input and output jacks may vary depending on the purchased model.
- The supported timing may vary by input signal. Download Resolution file from the website (see Product support on page 3). Refer to "Preset display modes" in Resolution file for more information.
- Avoid finger pressure on the screen surface. Finger pressure on the screen surface is prohibited. The screen may be damaged by excessive force.



- Consider the size and the weight of the product, you need assistance from another person when assembling or moving the monitor.
- Your monitor comes with an ultra-slimmed OLED panel and should be handled carefully. Never touch the upper part of the panel under any circumstances. Pressure or excessive force on the screen surface is prohibited as well.
- Be careful when handling the sharp monitor base and protect yourself from any physical harm.



#### 1. Prepare the area.

To unbox your product, you will need a clean area of about 300 x 120 cm on the floor.




Please be careful to prevent damage to the monitor. Placing the screen surface on an object like a stapler or a mouse will crack the glass or damage the OLED substrate voiding your warranty. Sliding or scraping the monitor around on your desk will scratch or damage the monitor surround and controls.


#### 2. Attach the monitor base.

Open the top cover of the package. Grab the tapes to lay the package down carefully on the floor. Make sure it is the printing of the product's rear view facing upwards as illustrated.


Hold the box tight from the holders at the bottoms, and grab the tapes to take the EPE cushions and the package contents out.




Remove the cushion that protects the back of the monitor.




Attach the monitor stand to the monitor base as illustrated.




Raise the thumbscrew lid and tighten the thumbscrew as illustrated. Then push the lid back.




Push out the bottom of the VESA plate so the stand could be installed easily to the monitor later.




Orient and align the stand arm with the monitor.




Fix the stand to the monitor by the provided screws and screwdriver.



Slide the VESA cover down from the top of the monitor stand until it locks into place.




Lift the monitor and the cushion carefully by holding them together as illustrated. Never touch the upper part of the panel under any circumstances.




Remove the cushion that protects the screen surface. Always hold the monitor from the back without touching the panel to keep it stable.







# 3. Connect the power cable to the monitor.


Plug one end of the power cord into the socket labelled on the rear of the monitor. Do not connect the other end to a power outlet just yet.



#### 4. Connect the video cable.

The video cables included in your package and the socket illustrations in this document may vary depending on the product supplied for your region.

1. Establish a video cable connection.




- Connect the plug of the HDMI cable to the HDMI port on the monitor.
- · Connect the plug of the DP cable to the monitor video socket.
- Connect the plug of the supplied USB-C™ cable to the USB-C™ port on the monitor. It allows signal, audio, and data transmission from the laptop to the monitor.
- 2. Connect the other end of the video cable to an appropriate port of a digital output source (e.g., a computer or a gaming console).

#### 5. Connect the audio cable.

You may connect headphones to the headphone jack found on the back side of the monitor.

Connect with an amplifier via the SPDIF jack and a coaxial cable (purchased separately) if desired.




#### 6. Connect USB devices.

Connect the USB cable between the PC and the

monitor (via the upstream USB port at the back) (1). This upstream USB port transmits data between the PC and the USB devices connected to the monitor.

Connect USB devices via other USB ports

(downstream) on the monitor (2). These downstream USB ports transmit data between connected USB devices and the upstream port.



#### 7. Tilt the monitor.

You should position the monitor and angle the screen to minimize unwanted reflections from other light sources.

Tilt the monitor by holding the lower part of the monitor.

Your monitor comes with an ultra-slimmed OLED panel and should be handled carefully. Never touch the upper part of the panel under any circumstances. Pressure or excessive force on the screen surface is prohibited as well.

#### 8. Connect-to and turn-on the power.


Connect the power cord to the power adapter. Plug the other end of the power cord into a power outlet and turn it on.

Picture may differ from product supplied for your region.

Turn on the monitor by pressing the power button on the monitor.

Turn on the computer too. If you have multiple video sources, press the looping key and the 5-way controller to select an input source.

To extend the service life of the product, we recommend that you use your computer's power management function.


#### 1. Power off the monitor.


Turn off the monitor and the power before unplugging the power cable. Turn off the computer before unplugging the monitor signal cable.


#### 2. Prepare the monitor and area.

Protect the screen surface with the cushion from the packing that used to ship the product in the first place. Lay the monitor with the screen facing down carefully.

- Your monitor comes with an ultra-slimmed OLED panel and should be handled carefully. Never touch the upper part of the panel under any circumstances. Pressure or excessive force on the screen surface is prohibited as well.
- Consider keeping the box and packaging in storage for use in the future when you may need to transport or mount the monitor. The fitted foam packing is ideal for protecting the monitor during transport or mounting bracket installation.









#### 3. Remove the VSEA cover.

Remove the stand hinge cover with a opening pry tool (purchased separately).



#### 4. Remove the monitor stand.

Release the screws that fix the stand to the monitor. Then pull the monitor stand backward away from the monitor.




#### 5. Remove the monitor base.

Release the screw on the bottom of the monitor base and detach the monitor base as illustrated.



In case you intend to use your monitor on the stand in the future, please keep the monitor base and monitor stand somewhere safe for future use.



# Using the monitor wall mounting kit (purchased separately)


The back of your monitor has a VESA standard mount with 200mm pattern, allowing the installation of a wall mount bracket. Before starting to install a monitor wall mounting kit, please read the precautions carefully.

#### **Precautions**

- Install your monitor and monitor mounting kit on a wall with flat surface.
- Ensure that the wall material and the standard wall mount bracket (purchased separately) are stable enough to support the weight of the monitor. Refer to the product specifications on the website for weight information.
- Turn off the monitor and the power before disconnecting the cables from the monitor.


#### 1. Remove the monitor stand.


#### 2. Identify the mounting holes.

If your mount bracket can be fixed to the mounting holes as illustrated directly, go to Follow the instruction manuals of the wall mount bracket you purchased to complete the installation. on page 30.




If your mount bracket (e.g., a TV mount bracket) cannot be fixed to the mounting holes directly, you need to tighten the provided spacer bolts to the mounting holes first. And then fix the mount bracket to the secured spacer bolts.

To tighten the spacer bolts, use a wrench or a socket wrench (purchased separately). Do not use an electric wrench to prevent the thread from stripping.





# The remote control and its effective range



- 1. Follow the instructions in Installing the battery on page 18 to get the remote control ready.
- 2. Aim the remote control at the monitor. The IR remote control sensor is located at the front of the monitor with a range of 6 meters approximately at an angle of 30 degrees (left and right) and 30 degrees (up and down). Make sure that there are not obstacles between the remote control and the IR sensor on the monitor.

- 3. To switch an input source / scenario, press the looping key. See Switching the inputs quickly on page 34 for more information.



- You are prompted to complete the configuration again after a system reset from Menu > System > Reset All.
- If you have switched off the scenario configuration from **Menu > Input > Scenario**, the scenario of each input is set to be **Standard** by default.

# Switching the inputs quickly

1. Press the looping key on the monitor or the ( ) key on the remote control to bring up the input source selection menu. Each source is preset for a scenario as described in Setting up your monitor for different scenarios on page 33. The scenario changes with the input source.







## Working with the HDRi hot key

The monitor takes advantage of Bright Intelligence Plus technology to balance screen brightness while playing HDR content to keep all image details. You are provided with a hot key on the monitor or on the remote control to switch to a preferred HDR setting easily.

- Make sure HDR content is available. See Working with HDR technology on page 39 for more information. HDR function is enabled automatically once HDR content is available to the monitor.
- 2. Press the HDRi hot key to bring up a list of HDR options.
- 3. Press the same key repeatedly to cycle through the options to the desired one. See Color Mode menu on page 50 for more information.

# Adjusting screen brightness automatically (Bright Intelligence Plus)



The Bright Intelligence Plus function works with certain color modes only. If it is not available, its menu options will become grayed out.

The built-in light sensor works with Bright Intelligence Plus technology to detect the ambient light, image brightness, contrast, and color temperature, and then balance the screen automatically. It helps keep image details as well as to reduce eye strain.

To enable this function, go to a mode from **Color Mode** > a mode > **B.I.+** (Bright Intelligence Plus) > **ON**. It takes a few seconds to complete the adjustment. Go to B.I.+ (Bright Intelligence Plus) on page 55 for more adjustments.

If you select **Game HDRi** or **Cinema HDRi**, the Bright Intelligence Plus function is enabled automatically. You can disable it from **Color Mode** > **Game HDRi** / **Cinema HDRi** > **B.I.+**.



The performance of Bright Intelligence Plus may be impacted by the light sources and the monitor tilt angle. You can increase the light sensor sensitivity from **Eye care > B.I.+** (Bright Intelligence Plus) > **Sensor Sensitivity** if needed. See page 55 for more information.

# Working with HDR technology

To enable HDR function, you need to have a compatible player and content.

1. Make sure a FHD HDR player is ready. Players with the following names and resolutions are supported.

- 2. Make sure HDR content is available. Content may come from a FHD player.
- 3. Make sure the player and the monitor have been connected via an appropriate cable:
  - the provided HDMI / DP / DP to mini DP cable / USB-C™ cable (if available)
  - an HDMI cable that is HDMI High Speed or HDMI Premium certified (for models with HDMI inputs)
  - a DP / DP to mini DP cable that is DisplayPort compliance certified (for models with DP inputs)
  - a certified USB-C<sup>™</sup> cable with DisplayPort Alternate Mode capability (for models with USB-C<sup>™</sup> inputs)

# **Enabling HDR function**

If the instructions in Working with HDR technology on page 39 are followed and the input content is HDR-compatible, the OSD message **HDR: On** is displayed on the screen. This means your content player and content are HDR-compatible and the HDR function is properly enabled. The monitor is following the ST2084 standard to process the HDR content. In this case, the monitor is set to **Game HDRi** by default.

You can press the HDRi hot key to bring up the HDR settings and select another HDR mode from the list. Alternatively, go to **Color Mode** for selection.

## **Enabling HDR-emulated mode**

If the connection is complete and no OSD message is displayed, this means the content player and/or the content are not HDR-compatible. The monitor stays to the color mode recently chosen for non-HDR content. You can manually enable HDR-emulated mode by selecting **HDR**, **Game HDRi**, or **Cinema HDRi** from **Color Mode**.





# Enabling color vision accessibility (Color Weakness)

**Color Weakness** is accessibility that helps people with color vision deficiency to distinguish colors. You are provided with **Red Filter** and **Green Filter** on this monitor. Choose one as needed.

- 1. Press 🍑 / 🍑 / 🍑 to bring up the Quick Menu.
- 2. Go to Menu > Eye care > Color Weakness.
- 3. Choose either **Red Filter** or **Green Filter**.
- 4. Adjust the value of the filter. A stronger effect is produced as the value increases.

# Displaying two or more sources at the same time (Multiple-Input)

To display two input sources on the screen at the same time, you can enable **Multiple-Input** and go for Picture-in-Picture (PIP) or Picture-by-Picture (PBP) mode.

- 7. The selected color mode is applied to the main screen only. You can adjust the settings either from the Quick Menu or the main menu. The color mode of the sub screen, however, cannot be changed.
- 8. Turn on the HDR function if it was turned off in step 2.
- 9. If you have audio input from both sources, the monitor's speakers output the audio signals from the main screen by default. 


You can optimize the monitor to enhance your gaming experience. You might want to start with the following steps.



Depending on the operating system on your PC, different procedures should be followed to adjust the screen refresh rate. Refer to the Help document of your operating system for details.

1. Set the screen refresh rate to **120 Hertz** (120 Hz). Right-click the desktop and select **Screen resolution**. Click **Advanced settings**. Under the **Monitor** tab, change the screen refresh rate to **120 Hertz**. And then click **Apply** and **Yes** to confirm the change.





- 2. Go to the setup menu in your game, and change the frame rate or screen refresh rate to 120 Hz. Refer to the Help document that came with your game for details.
- To check if the screen refresh rate has been changed, go to the Quick Menu on your monitor and check the system information.



If 120 Hz is not available on your menus, check the following:

- make sure the DisplayPort cable is properly connected to your computer and the monitor
- make sure your GPU supports 120 Hz
- make sure your game supports 120 Hz.

## Preventing image retention

To prevent image retention, the monitor needs to perform panel protection operation after using it for a certain period of time.

You are highly recommended to perform panel protection operations when you are prompted to by OSD messages. A monitor without these operations will void warranty and may not be able to keep excellent image quality. Required operations vary by the time the monitor is used.

After 4 hours of monitor use, you will be asked to perform **Off RS**. Select **YES** to proceed. It takes about 10 minutes and the power LED indicator flashes amber during the operation. Keep your monitor on and plugged in. Wait until the power LED indicator turns to solid white. To manually

perform **Off RS**, press / / to bring up the **Quick Menu**. Go to **Menu > System > OLED Settings > Off RS**.

After 500 hours of monitor use, you will be asked to perform **JB**. Select **YES** to proceed. It takes about 2 minutes and the power LED indicator flashes white and amber during the operation.

Keep your monitor on and plugged in. Wait until the power LED indicator turns to solid white. To manually perform JB, press / / / to bring up the Quick Menu. Go to Menu > System > OLED Settings > JB.

# Working with two or more video sources with one set of keyboard and mouse (**KVM**)

If you have two or more input systems, you might find yourself busy going back and forth between several sets of keyboard and mouse to control each display separately. Now with the KVM feature and sufficient I/O ports on one monitor, you can work with one set of keyboard and mouse only. With appropriate connections, the display is switched to the available input while the keyboard and mouse control is switched as well.

## Establishing KVM connections

- 1. Make USB-C™ connection properly. See Connect the video cable. on page 24 for reference.
- 2. Make HDMI or DP connection properly.
  - HDMI and USB upstream connections
  - · DisplayPort and USB upstream connections
- 3. Connect a keyboard and a mouse to the USB ports on the monitor.
- 4. After two or more sets of connections are made properly, the **KVM** function is enabled automatically. You can switch the control by the ( ) key on the remote control.


# Frequently asked questions (FAQ)

## **Imaging**





Does the blurring only occur at resolutions lower than the native (maximum) resolution?



Pixel errors can be seen.

One of several pixels is permanently black, one or more pixels are permanently white, one or more pixels are permanently red, green, blue or another color.

• Clean the monitor screen.

- Cycle power on-off.
- These are pixels that are permanently on or off and is a natural defect that occurs in OLED technology.
- The image has a faulty coloration.
- It has a yellow, blue or pink appearance.

  Go to the selected color mode from **Color Mode**. Select **Reset Color**, and then choose **YES** to reset the color settings to the factory defaults.

If the image is still not correct and the OSD also has faulty coloration, this means one of the three primary colors is missing in the signal input. Now check the signal cable connectors. If any pin is bent or broken off, please contact your dealer to get necessary support.

- The image is distorted, flashes or flickers.
- Download **Resolution file** from the website (see Product support on page 3). Refer to "Adjusting the Screen Resolution". And then select the correct resolution, refresh rate and make adjustments based on these instructions.
- You are running the monitor at its native resolution, but the image is still distorted.
- Images from different input sources may appear distorted or stretched on the monitor running at its native resolution. To have the optimal display performance of each type of input sources, you can use the **Display** function to set a proper aspect ratio for the input sources. See Display on page 63 for details.
- The image is displaced in one direction.
- Download **Resolution file** from the website (see <u>Product support on page 3</u>). Refer to "Adjusting the Screen Resolution". And then select the correct resolution, refresh rate and make adjustments based on these instructions.





- Activate the power management function to let your computer and monitor go into a low power "sleep" mode when not actively in use.
- Use a screensaver to prevent the occurrence of image retention.

#### Power LED indicator




The LED indicator is white or orange.



- If the LED lights up in solid white, the monitor is powered on.
- If the LED is illuminated in white and there is a message **Out of Range** on the screen, this means you are using a display mode that this monitor does not support, please change the setting to one of the supported mode. Download **Resolution file** from the website (see Product support on page 3). Refer to "**Adjusting the Screen Resolution**". And then select the correct resolution, refresh rate and make adjustments based on these instructions.
- If the LED is illuminated in white and the screen is black, the monitor is performing panel protection process as described in Preventing image retention on page 44. Wait for about 2 minutes until the LED indicator turns to solid white.
- If the LED is illuminated in orange, the power management mode is active. Press any button on the computer keyboard or move the mouse. If that does not help, check the signal cable connectors. If any pin is bent or broken off, please contact your dealer to get necessary support.
- If the LED is illuminated in white and amber and the screen is black, the monitor is performing panel protection process as described in Preventing image retention on page 44. Wait for about one hour until the LED indicator turns to solid white.
- If the LED is off, check the power supply mains socket, the external power supply and the mains switch.

#### OSD controls







To unlock the OSD controls when it is preset to be locked, press and hold any key for 10 seconds.

### OSD messages



A message **Out of Range** on the screen during computer boot up process.



If there is a message **Out of Range** on the screen during computer boot up process, this means computer compatibility caused by operating system or graphic card. The system will adjust the refresh rate automatically. Just wait until the operating system is launched.

#### **Audio**



No sound can be heard from the built-in speakers.



- Check whether the desired cable to input audio signals is properly connected. See Connect the audio cable. on page 24 for details.
- Increase the volume (volume may be muted or too low).
- Remove your headphone and/or external speakers. (If they are connected to the monitor, the built-in speakers are automatically muted.)



No sound can be heard from the connected external speakers.



- Remove your headphone (if the headphone is connected to the monitor).
- Check whether the headphone jack is properly connected.
- If the external speakers are USB-powered, check whether the USB connection is OK.
- Increase the volume (volume may be muted or too low) on the external speakers.

#### Sensors



The light sensor of the monitor does not work well.



The light sensor is located at the front bottom of the monitor. Please check:

- If you have removed the sensor protection sticker.
- If the Bright Intelligence / Bright Intelligence Plus function has been turned on. Check **Color Mode** > a mode > **B.I.+** (Bright Intelligence Plus).
- If there are any obstacles in front of the sensor that keep the sensor from detecting the light properly.
- If there are any objects or clothing in bright colors in front of the sensor. Bright colors (especially white and fluorescent colors) reflect light and the sensor cannot detect the main light sources.



#### **HDR**



There is a message HDR: Emulated showing on the screen.



This means the input content is not HDR-compatible and the monitor is in HDR-emulated mode. Refer to Working with HDR technology on page 39 to check if a supported player, content, and the certified cable are used.
